Commodities: Price rise continues.

Our partner for the commodity reports, the IKB Deutsche Industriebank AG reports about a further recovery of the world steel market. At the end of August, the production level was already back on the 2008 level – again driven by China. In the line of increasing exports, scrap prices have gone up also – even though scrap traders in Germany had even higher expectations.

The recyclers' view: First e-steward certificate in Europe

The e-steward standards have been applied to a treatment company in the UK (http://www.presseportal.de/pm/81636). E-stewards is a standard developed by the Basel Action Network (BAN) www.ban.org It is comparable to the RENE quality charta put into force within the RENE network of European recycling companies back in 2004: independent external specialists (www.bifa.de) audit the treatment plans regularly and thus enable the achievement of the WEEE-Directive's quality objectives. In this respect, RENE AG appreciates the e-steward initiative as it emphasises the underlying logic of our genuine approach.

A court case from the OLG Naumburg, Germany, has confirmed that producers of EEE can engage in advertising prior to the approval of their brands' registration by the Stiftung elektro-altgeräte-register © .

During an Interpol conference held in Lyon, France, participants have claimed more support from the EU countries for fighting illegal waste transports – especially to Africa. Particularly the UK has pointed out that information flow between the countries is key and today still too poor.

As part of the approval process of the producer compliance schemes' (PCS) 2011 to 2013 operational plans, the UK Environment Agency (http://www.environment-agency.gov.uk) (EPA) has intensified the cooperation with the PCS. This includes further insight evaluations of the PCS organisation, but includes also direct support for enforcing the UK WEEE regulations into the market. Italy: SISTRI again delayed.

The deadline for distributing the USB keys for SISTRI participants (www.sistri.it) has been delayed to the 30th November 2010. Using waste identity forms and the register itself has even been pushed back to the 31st December 2010.

Luxembourg: Changes in tariffs

The WEEE compliance scheme Ecotrel has decreased membership tariffs on the 1st October 2010. Ecotrel points out that members thus benefit from the changing economic environment in the WEEE sector. On the contrary, the collective system for batteries and accumulators, Ecobatterien, will significantly increase the tariffs on the 1st January 2011.

Austria: Significant 2009 collection volume.

Throughout 2009 the Austrian schemes have collected 9,32 kg of WEEE per inhabitant. This represents an increase of 15,7 % towards 2008.
