Commodities: New steel record, upwards tendency in 2012.

Our partner for raw material reports, the IKB Deutsche Industriebank AG (www.ikb.de) confirms the record emission of crude steel of 1.55 billion tonnes until the end of 2012. The growth came primary from Asia. For 2013, an emission of 1.6 billion tonnes will be forecasted. In November, there has been an unexpectedly strong increase in scrap prices. Also for 2013, the IKB expects a slight incline.

Producer responsibility: Restructuring of ear

In the context of the last ExFo meeting "international material prohibitions, RoHS, REACh, EuP, as well as ElektroG/WEEE" of the Fraunhofer IPA on the 6th December 2012, Mrs. Nathalie Buijs from the industrial association SPECTARIS (www.spectaris.de) spoke about the possibilities of the member's interest group. SPECTARIS has founded a new working group "electrical devices" with the "Stiftung elektro-altgeräte-register ©" (ear), which should be about the restructuring of ear. Especially, the "aspects B2B/B2C" should be taken stronger into consideration in future.

The interest group of the substantial Europe's ITC and CE producers has published a Memo, in which the requests to the realization of the WEEE-Recast in the EU-member states are defined. A special focus lays on the information gathering and recycling quality. These aspects are often beyond the producer's sphere of influence. Therefore, a concentration on the producer responsibility is obviously inadequate.

In the beginning of November, the federal government has presented the draft to the change of the ElektroG, with which the directive 2011/65/EU is realized. Hence § 5 ElektroG has no own operational execution content anymore.

Italy: RENE AG as WEEE-take-back system confirmed

On the 13th December 2012 the RENE AG Italia, Brixen, has been officially accepted by general assembly of the Centro di Coordinamento RAEE(CdC, RAEE, <u>www.cdcraee.it</u>) as a new member. The regional allocation of the pick-up area will take place on 24th April 2013.

Belgium: Recupel picks up for free.

The Belgian take-back system Recupel has launched a take-back action, on which all used electrical devices are picked up from the end-user for free. The registration takes place online.

Netherlands: Responsibility shifts from Agentshap NL.

Beginning of 1st January 2013 the responsibility for WEEE, Batteries and packaging will be given to the Inspectie Leefomgeving en Transport and not anymore from Agenshap NL.

Brazil: Draft legislation to Reverse Manufacturing of WEEE.

A new draft legislation to protect the environment and health with regard to reuse from WEEE in the production has been published in Brazil. Submissions are possible until the 7th January 2013.
