Commodities: Damped expectations.

Our partner for raw material reports, the IKB Deutsche Industriebank AG (<u>www.ikb.de</u>) takes back the forecast for the worldwide crude steel production of 1.6 billions tonnes to 1.55 billions (see RENE WEEE News September 2012). This would still be, however, an increase by 2 % compared with the previous year. For the scrap prices, the IKB predicts a slight upwards potential in October.

Producer responsibility: Reuse – more complicated as you think

The authors Dr. Jens Nusser and Dr. Ralf Brüning think out of the box in their article "Wiederverwendung von Elektrogeräte neu definiert". They ask themselves, for example, whether reused appliances have to keep on restrictions from ElektroG, BattG, EVPG, EMVG and FTEG as a new device by definition. Also the potential export restrictions of repairable used devices in third countries with low hourly wages is questioned, especially with regard to the destruction of a "micro economic in export countries which is just under construction"

UK: Africa WEEE – Consulting form Great Britain/ BIS & WEEE2

The African Ministerial Conference on the Environment (AMCEN) in Arusha, Tansania has been supported by actors from the British WEEE sector with the development of a so-called WEEE-Declaration. Thereby the standard of WEEE-Recycling in Africa should be increased. The participants from the UK side were: Reclamed Appliances, HP, Dell, Nokia, Philips, the United Nations Industrial Development Organisation (UNIDO) and the University of Northampthon's School of Science and Technology.
